

In his spare time Jeff enjoys fishing and spending time with his family.



# Inside The Ranks A Message from Robert Adams


All of us have thought at least once, "How can I save money and get a good return on that money". FBi Construction has tried to help all

employees accomplish this goal through participating in the 401K program. Listed below is a snapshot of how the program works:

- 1. Let Uncle Sam help Your contribution is deducted pre-tax (Federal & State). Depending on your tax bracket, the return could be 10% - 33% on your contribution.
- 2. FBi Construction's goal is to match 100% of your money. Because of IRS rules and regulations, some years we are unable to accomplish the 100% match. The minimum amount matched over the years has been 65%.
- 3. FBi Construction also contributes to the profit sharing plan. This return ranges from 3% 10% of your contribution.
- 4. Average returns on the invested funds have ranged from 7% 33%, depending on the selected funds.

In summary, if you receive 10% from Uncle Sam, 65% from the match, 3% from profit sharing and 7% from the investment, that would be an 85% return on your money. Yes, the stock market goes up and down. But your funds would have to lose 85% before your money would be affected. That has not happened since FBi Construction started the 401K program.

We encourage each of you to contribute even a minimum amount each week. You may be surprised how fast this will grow. Also, bonus money can be used to contribute. Therefore, if we give you the money (bonus) and contribute to the 401K on your behalf (match and profit sharing), it appears to be a NO BRAINER.
