The Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) green building rating system was established in 1998 by the U.S. Green Building Council to provide various standards towards environmental sustainable construction. The USGBC is the nation's leading nonprofit working to transform the building industry to sustainable practices. This system was designed to measure how well a building performs across the most important metrics which include: sustainable site development, energy efficiency, water conservation, materials and resources, innovation, and indoor environmental quality.

LEED is a voluntary certification program and can be applied to any building type and any building lifecycle phase. Focusing on sustainable sites, water efficiency, energy and atmosphere, materials and resources, innovation and design, indoor environmental quality, and awareness and education help promote a whole-building approach. Each of these areas are rated and are classified by levels. LEED has four levels of certification: Certified, Silver, Gold, and Platinum. Within each of these categories, prerequisites are given and must be achieved to ensure that every project contains the essential elements of a green building. Additional credits towards certification can also be accumulated by employing specific green strategies and achieving certain levels of building performances. Certification is based on a 100 point scale, and points are weighted by their potential to mitigate the negative and promote positive environmental impacts of a building.

Companies are also given the opportunity to become more advanced in the knowledge of the LEED's system. LEED Accredited Professionals are those who are building industry professionals who have demonstrated a thorough understanding of green building and "LEED Green Building Rating System". The LEED AP credential indicates that the professional has the knowledge and skills to facilitate the LEED certification process. This accreditation is a voluntary designation achieved by individuals who have passed the LEED Professional Accreditation exam. The Green Building Certification Institute recommends that LEED AP candidates have building industry knowledge, as well as experience working with green building professionals from multiple disciplines.

Having a LEED Accredited Professional allows companies to strengthen their green building qualifications, market green building knowledge to potential employers and clients, help LEED registered projects gain one point toward certification, and to earn recognition with the nations predominate green building professional credential. Together, the LEED Accredited Professional and clients can work together to increase their LEED level of certification.

At this time Kent Gunter is FBi Construction's in-house LEED AP. Fellow FBi employees, Ashton Estridge and Kyle Gunter, are both currently pursuing the LEED AP designation.
